



#### DISCLOSURE AND CONSENT - MEDICAL AND SURGICAL PROCEDURES

TO THE PATIENT: You have the right as a patient to be informed about your condition and the recommended surgical, medical or diagnostic procedure to be used so that you may make the decision whether or not to undergo the procedure after knowing the risks and hazards involved. This disclosure is not meant to scare or alarm you; it is simply an effort to make you better informed so you may give or withhold your consent to the procedure.

I consent to the use of blood and blood products as deemed necessary. I (we) understand that the following risks and hazards may occur in connection with the use of blood and blood products:

- a. Serious infection including but not limited to Hepatitis and HIV which can lead to organ damage and permanent impairment.
- b. Transfusion related injury resulting in impairment of lungs, heart, liver, kidneys and immune system.
- c. Severe allergic reaction, potentially fatal.

Just as there may be risks and hazards in continuing my present condition without treatment, there are also risks and hazards related to the performance of the surgical, medical, and/or diagnostic procedures planned for me. I (we) realize that common to surgical, medical and/or diagnostic procedures is the potential for infection, blood clots in veins and lungs, hemorrhage, allergic reactions, and even death. I (we) also realize that the following hazards may occur in connection with this particular procedure: Pain, severe bleeding, infection, damage to intra-abdominal structures (e.g., bowel, bladder, blood vessels, or nerves) with the need for additional surgery to repair injury. Intra-abdominal abscess and infectious complications, trocar site complications (e.g., hematoma/bleeding, leakage of fluid, or hernia formation), cardiac dysfunction, postoperative pneumothorax, subcutaneous emphysema, conversion of the procedure to an open procedure.

7. I (we) understand that Do Not Resuscitate (DNR), Allow Natural Death (AND) and all resuscitative restrictions are suspended during the perioperative period and until the post anesthesia recovery period is complete. All resuscitative measures will be determined by the anesthesiologist until the patient is officially discharged from the post anesthesia stage of care.

# CONSENT FOR EXAMINATION OF PELVIC REGION

For pelvic examinations under anesthesia for student training purposes.

A "pelvic examination" means a physical examination by a health care practitioner of a patient's external and internal reproductive organs, genitalia, or rectum.

During your procedure, your health care practitioner, or a resident designated by your health care practitioner, may perform or observe a pelvic examination on you while you are anesthetized or unconscious. This is a part of the procedure to which you have consented.

**With your further written consent**, your health care practitioner may perform, or allow a medical student or resident to perform or observe, a pelvic examination on you while you are anesthetized or unconscious, not as part of your procedure, but for <u>educational purposes</u>.

The pelvic examination is a critical tool to aid in the diagnosis of women's health conditions. It is an important skill necessary for students to master.

Your safety and dignity is of highest importance. All students and residents are under direct supervision during pelvic examinations.
