

STANDING DELEGATION ORDER FOR URINARY CATHETER REMOVAL

Once the urinary catheter is removed, assess for adequate bladder emptying.

NOTE If patient is incontinent, observe appropriate skin care/hygiene to prevent breakdown or development of pressure ulcer. (see Nursing Policies WI-319.0, WI-320.1, WI-320.2)

- 1. If patient voids within 4-6 hours of cath removal and the volume is less than or equal to 180 mL, confirm bladder emptying as follows:
 - a. If post void residual less than 500 mL per bladder scan, repeat bladder scan within 2 hours.
 - i. If bladder scan is less than 500 mL, SDO may be discontinued.
 - ii. If bladder scan is greater than 500 mL, continue to step b.
 - b. If post void residual greater than or equal to 500 mL per bladder scan, perform straight catheterization (Refer to GNP#NE-251.0). Recheck bladder scan within 6 hours.
 - i. If bladder scan is less than 500 mL, SDO may be discontinued.
 - ii. If bladder scan is greater than or equal to 500 mL, perform second straight catheterization (Refer to GNP#NE-251.0) and recheck bladder scan within 6 hours and continue.
 - After second catheterization, if bladder scan is less than 500 mL, SDO may be discontinued.

- After second catheterization, if bladder scan greater than or equal to 500 mL report to the patient's primary team. ORDER MUST COME
 FROM PRIMARY PHYSICIAN OR UROLOGY RESIDENT TO PLACE NEW URINARY CATHETER.
- 2. If patient has not voided within 4-6 hours and/or complains of bladder fullness, confirm bladder emptying as follows:
 - a. Ask patient to void and check for spontaneous urination within 2 hours.
 - i. If urinated volume is greater than 180 mL, SDO may be discontinued.
 - ii. If urinated volume is less than or equal to 180 mL or no void, perform bladder scan.
 - If post void residual per bladder scan is less than 500 mL, SDO may be discontinued.
 - If post void residual per bladder scan is greater than 500 mL perform straight catheterization (Refer to GNP#NE-251.0), recheck bladder scan within 6 hours and continue.
 - After straight catheterization, if bladder scan is less than 500 mL, SDO may be discontinued.
 - After straight catheterization, if bladder scan greater than or equal to 500 mL or patient continues to complain of bladder fullness, report to the patient's primary team. ORDER MUST
 COME FROM PRIMARY PHYSICIAN OR UROLOGY RESIDIENT TO PLACE NEW URINARY CATHETER.
